

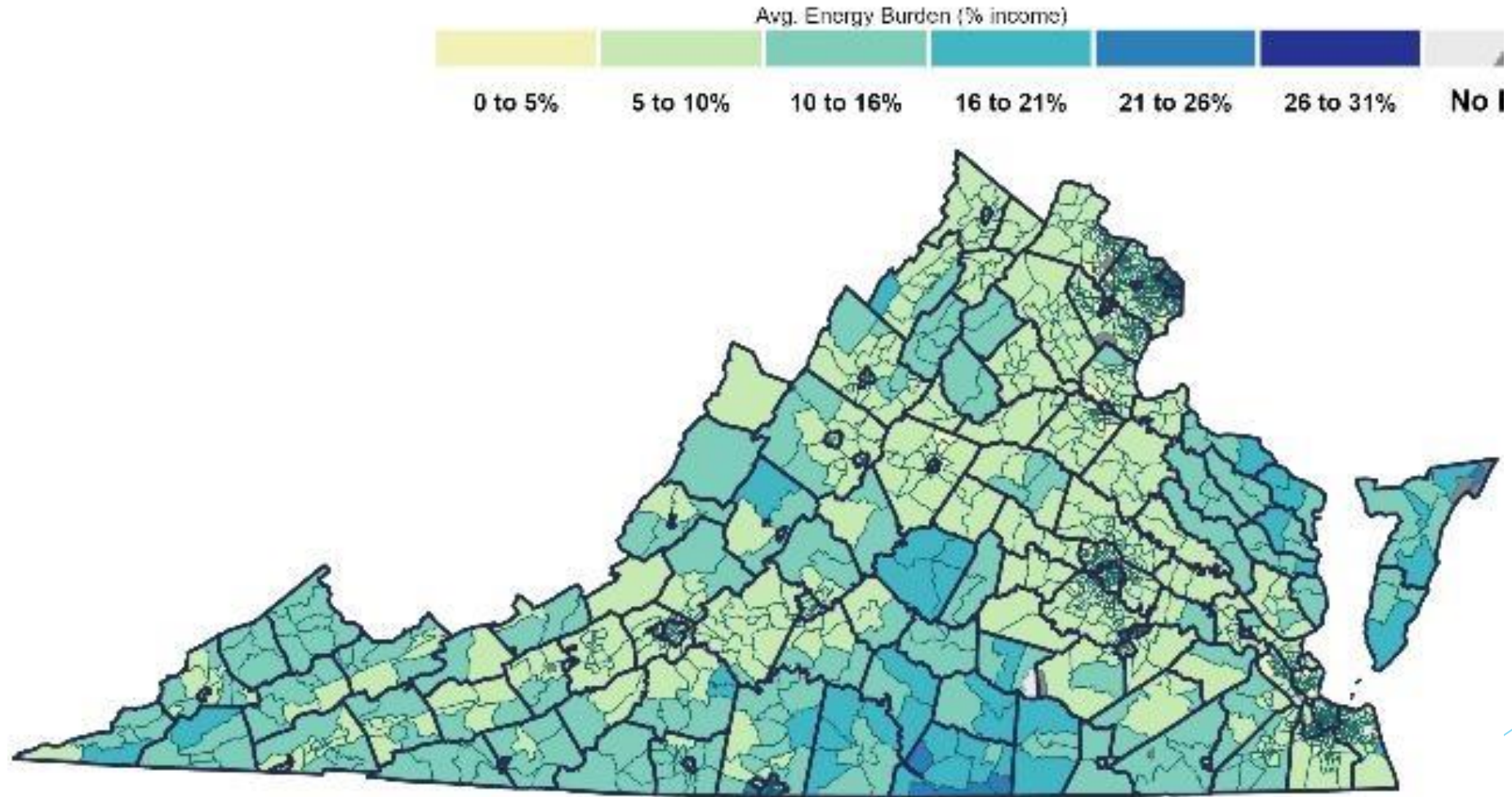


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Residential Energy Burdens

LOW TO MODERATE INCOME SOLAR FINANCING PROGRAM

- Established in 2019 to create “Low to Moderate Income (LMI) Solar Loan and Rebate Fund,” under advisement of the **Clean Energy Advisory Board**
- Goal to reduce energy burden through solarization
- Energy efficiency prerequisites (12% reduction required)
- Customer eligibility up to 80% of area median income
- Focusing on single family owner-occupied homes

VIRGINIA SHARED SOLAR

Subscription based model for Dominion Energy (DOM) customers and Multi-family Shared Solar (on-site, behind the meter) program in Old Dominion Power (ODP) and DOM

- A Shared Solar program (VA Code: § 56-594.3) in the Dominion Energy territory to include 30% low income subscribers.
- A program for multifamily shared solar (VA Code: § 56-585.1:12) in Dominion and Old Dominion Power territory.





LOCALITY SOLAR TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

- ▶ Funded by U.S. DOE and Virginia Energy, in partnership with UVA Weldon Cooper Center's Virginia Solar Initiative
- ▶ No-cost policy and technical assistance to local officials, private companies, land owners and other community members
- ▶ Research-based best practice approaches to the siting and permitting of small-scale, large commercial and utility-scale solar installations
 - ▶ Focus on solar resources, transparency, land use, permitting, and environmental decision-making
