# Virginia Energy Recognizes Coal Industry for Exemplary Safety and Reclamation Efforts in 2021

~Virginia Coal Miners Worked Over One Million Hours without a Lost Time Accident in 2021 ~

**Lebanon, Va.** - Virginia's Coal Industry was recognized and celebrated for an exemplary safety record and excellence in reclamation by the Virginia Department of Energy (Virginia Energy) and the Metallurgical Coal Producers Association (MCPA) this week.

Coal miners across the Commonwealth put in over one million work hours without any lost time accidents. There were no fatalities at coal mines in Virginia, either. Virginia Energy regulates safety at these sites.

"We can't stress enough how important the people are to us and we never want to miss the opportunity to celebrate this culture of safety at many of our mines," **said Virginia Energy Director of Coal Programs Randy Moore.** "The combination of Virginia Energy's inspection and support teams with and the commitment of our operators makes a difference in the mining environment."

We are proud of the men and women of our industry who will be recognized as some of the best in the business," said MCPA President Ben Beakes.
