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## Paramont Contura Takes Top Award in First Annual **Overmountain Mine Rescue Competition**

**Abingdon**, **Va. –** Paramont Contura took the top award at the first annual Overmountain Mine Rescue Competition. The event was co-hosted by National Mine Rescue Association Post 7 and the Virginia Department of Energy (Virginia Energy). Eight teams demonstrated skills specific to responding to an emergency in an underground mine at the Southwest Virginia Higher Education Center in Abingdon.

The event was named for the Overmountain Men. The were volunteers that came from Virginia, Kentucky and Tennessee, Soldiers mustered in Abingdon in 1780 and eventually fought and won the crucial Revolutionary War battle of Kings Mountain. In a similar spirit, this contest brought contestants from across the Appalachian region that also volunteer to serve as first responders to their fellow miners.

"The mine rescue community is one of a kind. These volunteers are willing to battle any conditions to save their fellow miners and we are grateful for their service," said National Mine Rescue Association Post 7 President Dave Goad. "These teams may be competitors here but, in an emergency, they would act as one. The fellowship amongst the various company participants is just as important as the contest."

"We are happy to have this important training here in Abingdon for the first time. The inspiring history of the Overmountain men coupled with the impressive talents of these responders is one-of-a-kind," said Virginia Energy Director of Coal Programs Randy **Moore**. "Virginia Energy's first priority is the safety of our mine workers, and this event is another tool to ensure they have the best responding should there be an emergency."

Day one of the competition tested skills in First Aid and bench. The bench competition requires miners to identify issues within breathing apparatuses used by the mine rescue teams. A Team Tech skills competition was also added to the contest where miners demonstrate how to ensure air quality underground is safe.

Day two featured the team competition. The field adjacent to the Southwest Virginia Higher Education Center was set up to emulate underground mines. Within each field were a set of problems which the teams had to work together to solve in the least amount of time. Mine Rescue teams were asked to rescue trapped miners, make sure the air quality underground was restored, put out fires and ensure the safety of all their fellow teammates throughout the competition. The teams are required to wear the breathing apparatuses while completing the problem.

Paramont Contura, Coronado Coal, Virginia Small Operators Mine Rescue and Wellmore Coal Company were the Virginia companies represented in the mine rescue competition. From West Virginia, Southern Pocahontas's Apache team and Affinity Mne Rescue took the field. Iron Senergy's Cumberland Mine team came to compete from Pennsylvania.
